THE AWARDS PROGRAM

The awards program recognizes the outstanding achievement of clubs and members at the District, State, Regional and National levels. All clubs are encouraged to participate. FGCMD award applications are sent electronically to your District Awards Chairman. Applications for Council awards and Flower Show awards, listed in this manual, are sent directly to the respective Council Chairman and Flower Show Evaluation Chairman.  - The purpose of the CAR-SGC Awards is to recognize excellence above the State level for outstanding club projects or achievements.
 - Applications for CAR-SGC Awards are made through the State Awards Chairman.
 - The FCGMD State Awards Chairman sends all CAR-SGC applications to the CAR-SGC Awards Chairman.
- 3. National NGC (National Garden Clubs, Inc.)

- Applications for NGC Awards are made through the State Awards Chairman.
- The FCGMD State Awards Chairman sends all NGC applications to the NGC Awards Chairman.

FGCMD Award Categories

State applications are judged according to the size of the club which is determined by number of members who pay NGC dues, including Garden Club Members (Active and Associate), Affiliates, State Life Members, etc. The categories are:

- 1. Small Club: 1 20 members
- 2. Medium Club: 21 50 members
- 3. Large Club: 51 + members

Awards

The award year is January 1 – December 31 for FGCMD, NGC & CAR-SGC. Award applications must be received by your District Awards Chairman, unless otherwise stated, by October 15.

Every award should be submitted to your District Awards Chairman for review. Contact your District Chairman first for any questions regarding the application or requirements.

Refer to the NGC and CAR-SGC websites for award information, as your project may be eligible for regional or national awards that are not listed in this manual. Applications for Regional and National Awards are made ONLY through the State Awards Chairman. Only one application per award category will be considered by the Regional and National Award Committees.

Award Applications - General Guidelines

All Award Applications can be found on the FGCMD website. Refer to the award to determine the appropriate application form. By submitting an application, you affirm that you have any required permissions / releases and that the images, photos and / or videos do not violate or infringe the copyright or other proprietary or intellectual property rights of others. You are giving the Federated Garden Clubs of Maryland (FGCMD), the Central Atlantic Region – State Garden Clubs (CAR-SGC) and National Garden Clubs (NGC) permission to use the images, photos and / or videos to promote FGCMD, CAR-SGC and NGC in the future. Images / photos taken at a public event or in a public space do not need photo releases.

- 1. Any Federated Garden Club of Maryland is eligible to apply.
- 2. The project or activity must have been completed by October 15. If the club project is not completed by October 15th, submit the award application the following year.
- 3. If the project or activity has won 1st place, 2nd place, 3rd place or Honorable Mention in the prior year, the project or activity may <u>not</u> be submitted for an Award in the following year.

- 4. Only one project or activity per award is acceptable.
- 5. If the same project is eligible for various awards, submitting exact duplications of the application is not acceptable.
- 6. The FGCMD / NGC Award Application consists of the Application cover sheet and up to three (3) printed pages, front-side only, including photographs. Application cover sheet in PDF or Word is available on the FGCMD website. Refer to https://gardenclub.org/sites/default/files/2023-01/creating-award-winning-application.pdf to create an award-winning application.
 - Address the criteria listed on the scoring evaluation sheet (commonly referred to as the General Scoring Rubric).
 - Select quality photographs (300 DPI, dots per inch) that show the beginning, middle and end of a project. One high quality photograph highlighting the finished product, preferably without people would be helpful in the application.
 - Save the application documents as a PDF or Word document for electronic submission.
 - Application File name should be labeled as follows:
 - District # Award# Size of Club Garden Club Initials
 - Example for District 8, G1 Award, Club size Medium, Keep Blooming Garden Club,:D8_G1_M_KBGC
- 7. The application packet is submitted to the District Awards Chairman electronically.
- 8. The District Awards Chairman must receive the Application packet by October 15th.
- 9. Retain a copy of your application packet for club records.

FGCMD / NGC General Scoring Rubric

The scoring evaluation sheet is commonly called the General Scoring Rubric. Most awards are judged using the General Scoring Rubric. NGC and CAR – SGC organizations use this terminology also. Individual applicants can use the General Scoring Rubric to evaluate the competitiveness of their application as it is the same General Scoring Rubric that will be used by the judges to assess points earned for each aspect of the submitted project.

Points and Placement

- 1. First Place 90-100 points
 - The entry MUST earn 90 or above to be considered for first place.
 - There will be only one first place award. In the event of ties for first place, judges must go back and reevaluate the applications.
- 2. Second Place 85-89 points
 - There can be a tie for second place
- 3. Third Place 80-84 points
 - There can be a tie for third place
- 4. Honorable Mention 75-80 points
 - There can be up to four awards

The award could also be considered for an additional FGCMD, NGC or CAR-SGC award if it places 90 or above.

FGCMD Awards Selection Process

- 1. The District Awards Chairman reviews the application(s) for completeness and sends the application(s) to the State Awards Chairman by October 30.
- 2. The FGCMD State Awards Selection Committee meets in November to review all applications. This committee is comprised of the State Awards Chairman, Vice-Chairman, District Awards Chairmen, District Directors and Members of the State Executive Board.
- 3. The FCGMD State Award recipients are selected after review and scoring by the Committee.
- 4. Youth Contests Award recipients are reviewed and selected by the State Awards Chairman, Vice Chairman and Youth Contests Awards Chairman.
- 5. Photography Awards are reviewed and selected by the State Awards Chairman, Vice Chairman and one professional photographer.
- 6. Council Awards are finalized by the respective Council Chairmen.

Regional and National Awards Process

- 1. FGCMD State Awards recipients, merited for Regional and National Awards, are sent to CAR SGC or NGC by the State Awards Chairman only.
- 2. FGCMD / CAR-SGC Yearbook Scoring Rubric will be utilized for judging yearbooks.

Announcement of Award Recipients

For Award applications submitted by October 15:

- 1. FGCMD Awards are announced at the District or State annual meetings in March. Refer to the Awards Calendar Schedule, page 7, for a complete list. Award recipients are published on the FGCMD website (https://fgcofmd.org/awards/) in the Awards Section after the State Annual Meeting.
- 2. CAR SGC Awards are announced at the annual meeting in the fall. CAR SGC Award information is available at www.car-sgc.org
- 3. NGC Awards are announced at their annual meeting in May/June following the award year. NGC Awards are published on the NGC website. https://www.gardenclub.org/publications and in Gardenews.

FGCMD AWARDS, COUNCILS, FLOWER SHOW AND YOUTH CONTESTS CALENDAR

The FGCMD Awards year is January 1st through December 31st of each calendar year. If a project is not completed by the designated deadline, save it and submit it the following year. Awards categories are listed top to bottom in the left column in the order they are due.

FEDERATED GARDEN CLUBS OF MARYLAND, INC. (FGCMD)

AWARDS

Award applications are available on the FGCMD website https://www.fgcofmd.org/awards/. Flower Show Forms are available https://www.fgcofmd.org/coucilsandschools/flowershows/

Unless otherwise noted, applications must be received by your District Awards Chairman by October 15. All applications must be submitted electronically (PDF or Word). Printed copies will no longer be accepted. Refer to https://gardenclub.org/sites/default/files/2023-01/creating-award-winning-application.pdf

Awards marked with an asterisk [*] indicate a silver or pewter bowl/tray is presented to the recipient at the Annual Meeting in March. Each recipient receives a certificate and photograph of themselves with the award.

Exception: The Dessie Moxley Youth Involvement and Development Award winner will keep their tray.

GENERAL AWARDS - CONSERVATION, CIVIC DEVELOPMENT, COMMUNITY SERVICE, ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS, HISTORIC PRESERVATION, GARDEN THERAPY

FGCMD/NGC Award Application Cover Sheet required. With the exception of Garden Therapy, the below awards are eligible for the FGCMD Selection Committee Awards on page 9.

- **G1 CIVIC DEVELOPMENT AWARD** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for improvement of a playground, school, civic building, historic landmark, or environmental project. Before and after photographs are necessary.
- **G2 COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD (1981)** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for meritorious service in a community through an activity or project reflecting the objectives of the Federated Garden Clubs of Maryland, Inc. A club may receive only one Community Service award per year.
- **G3 JOANNA TILGHMAN ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS AWARD (2011)** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for a project or activity that is bay-wise and most exemplifies bay wise techniques and practices to help clean-up and maintain the Chesapeake Bay.
- **G4 HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARD** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for a project involving the restoration of an historic site, such as the restoration or recreation of a garden, outbuilding, fencing, walls, walkways, etc.
- **G5 DECORATING HISTORIC HOMES** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for tastefully decorating an historic building/house/mansion. Decorations are not required to be of the period of the building but should be creative, distinctive, and harmonize with the building's style. Designer's choice of all materials within purview of curator, official, or owner of the building.
- **G6 GARDEN THERAPY AWARD (1988)** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for sponsoring an outstanding program of garden therapy. Given for the establishment or restoration of a garden(s) that benefit the physically or learning challenged residents in nursing homes, schools, prisons, low-income housing, cancer centers, etc. Includes barrier free gardens, accessible gardening (raised beds), community gardens, meditation gardens at a hospital etc. The goals of these gardens can also be to increase awareness or give hope. In addition, FGCMD accepts projects that engage participants in small hands-on activities using physical and mental skills to create something or have a sensory experience. Examples may include, but are not limited to, potting plants, botanical arts projects or creating small arrangements.
- **G7 GARDEN FOOD BANK AWARD (2024)** A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for donating food to a local food bank or for working with a community garden in which food is distributed to a local food bank.

MEMBERSHIP AWARDS

No application required. Awarded based on the records of the FGCMD Central Office

- M1 CLEMSON BOWL * (1998) The silver bowl may be awarded biennially to the District gaining the most new clubs during a two year Administration.
- **M2 DISTRICT BOWL** * **(1980)** The silver bowl may be awarded annually for the greatest percentage increase in District membership in the calendar year. If a tie in percentages occurs, the District with the largest number of new clubs would win. If a tie still exists, the number of new Life Members will be the deciding factor.

PHOTOGRAPHY AWARDS

FGCMD Photography Award Application required; Individuals must be the photographer and may submit only one photograph per award. Size: 4"x 6", 1800 x 1200 pixels; 300 DPI. Photos must be submitted electronically as a JPEG. In applying for this award, the applicant gives the State permission to use pictures and information contained herein on State Communications. Award panel will consist of one professional photographer and the FGCMD Awards Committee Chair/Vice-Chair using the FGCMD Photography Rubric specific for each award.

- **P1 ANNETTE RICHTER PHOTOGRAPHY AWARD (2006)** A \$50 check award may be presented to the recipient for beauty of a *Maryland native plant* (vine, shrub or flower) as expressed through photography. Close-up photograph preferred. Applicant must be the photographer.
- **P2 DISTRICT DIRECTORS PHOTOGRAPHY AWARD (2009)** A \$50 check award may be presented to the recipient for beauty of flower, fruit or leaf formation of an *annual plant*, tree or shrub, bird or insect expressed through photography. A close-up shot is preferred. Applicant must be the photographer. Sponsored by FGCMD District Directors.
- **P3 HARRY C. REYNOLDS PHOTOGRAPHY AWARD (1986)** Certificate may be awarded for beauty of **overall silhouette** (a dark solid shape image of a subject against a lighter background) of trees or shrubs as expressed through photography.
- **P4 MARY F. FITZPATRICK PHOTOGRAPHY AWARD (1976)** Certificate may be awarded for artistic excellence (mastery of skills and techniques in flower arrangement) as expressed through photography. Applicant must be the designer **and** photographer.

YOUTH GARDENERS AWARDS

FGCMD/NGC Award Application Cover Sheet required

- YG1 DESSIE MOXLEY YOUTH INVOLVEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT AWARD * (2010) A pewter tray may be awarded to a Federated Garden Club for activity completed within the current year with youth or with an organized Youth Gardener Club(s). For this award, club size is not a consideration and the criteria will be based on the overall project. The same project may not be submitted in two consecutive years for this award.
- **YG2 STIEFF YOUNG GARDENERS ACHIEVEMENT BOWL** * The silver bowl may be awarded for the best civic project by a youth gardener club.

PUBLICATIONS / YEARBOOK AWARDS

FGCMD/NGC Award Application Cover Sheet required for Publications Award PY1; No application cover sheet needed for Yearbook Award PY2. The FGCMD / CAR-SGC Yearbook Scoring Rubric will be used to evaluate yearbooks.

- PY1 PUBLICATIONS AWARD (2001) A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for submitting:
 - 1. Newsletters/Magazines/Bulletins distributed at least three times per current year under one editor;
 - 2. Manual or Handbook supporting any of the NGC objectives, i.e., procedural, duties of officers, awards, etc.;
 - 3. Educational Publication promoting NGC objective, i.e., design, environmental, landscape, gardening, horticulture, therapy, etc.
- **PY2 YEARBOOK AWARD** A certificate may be awarded for a yearbook submitted by a FGCMD garden club and scoring 90 points or more in each of the following categories: Small Club: 1 20 members, Medium Club: 21 50 members, Large Club: 51 + members.

BLUE STAR / GOLD STAR MEMORIAL MARKER AWARDS

FGCMD/NGC Award Application Cover Sheet required

- **S1** Certificate of Merit may be awarded for the most outstanding Blue Star Memorial Marker Landscaping project. The project may have been continuous, but major landscaping must have been completed within two years.
- **S2** Certificate of Merit may be awarded for the most outstanding Gold Star Memorial Marker Landscaping project. The project may have been continuous, but major landscaping must have been completed within two years.

FGCMD PRESIDENTIAL / EXECUTIVE BOARD AWARDS

No application required except as noted

PE1 - PERENNIAL BLOOM AWARD

Perennial Bloom Application is required and due to District Awards Chairman by February 1 Eligible for CAR-SGC Perennial Bloom Award

Honors a long-time garden club member who has made gardens grow and bloom with their continuous support of NGC goals and objectives. This individual has provided their service as officers and chairmen, has promoted garden events and programs and has inspired others with their enthusiastic leadership. Along with the award of recognition, a tree or shrub is planted in honor by their club. The FGCMD recipient is nominated for the CAR-SGC Perennial Bloom Award.

PE2 - MEMBER AWARD OF HONOR (1994)

NGC Application SR-4 required and Book of Evidence due to FGCMD State Awards Chairman by January 1 Eligible for the CAR-SGC Member Award of Honor

A certificate may be awarded to one individual member of an FGCMD club whose volunteer efforts during a period of 5 or more years have made outstanding contributions to club and community in one or more of the following areas: Civic Development, Horticulture Therapy, Youth Activities, Conservation, Landscape Design, Horticulture, Floral Design or all around Excellence. The FGCMD recipient is nominated for the CAR-SGC Award of Honor, and the CAR-SGC recipient is nominated for the NGC Award of Honor. The Nominee must not be a current member of the NGC Board of Directors.

- **PE3 AWARD OF ACHIEVEMENT (1981)** A certificate may be awarded to an individual member, member club or group of member clubs for an activity worthy of recognition in promotion of the objectives of the Federated Garden Clubs of Maryland, Inc.
- **PE4 CITATION (1959)** A certificate may be awarded to an individual selected by the Executive Committee, and approved by the Executive Board, for meritorious service in promoting the objectives of the Federated Garden Clubs of Maryland.
- **PE5 AWARD OF APPRECIATION (1983)** A certificate may be awarded to a non-garden club member for an activity worthy of recognition in promotion of the Federated Garden Clubs of Maryland, Inc.
- **PE6 PRESIDENTIAL AWARD (1995)** A certificate may be awarded to an individual/s in recognition for help received during an administration.
- **PE7 MARIE COULTER BOWL** * **(2009)** The silver bowl may be awarded to an individual member, member club or group of member clubs for their role and activities in promoting the objectives of CAR-SGC and NGC. (excluding exofficio terms as President of FGCMD).

FGCMD SELECTION COMMITTEE AWARDS

No application required. Outstanding projects from the General Awards on page 7 may be considered for the following recognition:

- **SE1 EVELYN M. COTTON MARYLAND CONSERVATION AWARD** * (1983) The silver bowl may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club or individual member for any outstanding conservation project.
- **SE2 GOVERNOR'S BEAUTIFICATION BOWL** * The silver bowl may be awarded to the top-scoring FGCMD garden club for any outstanding civic improvement.
- **SE3 MAE SCOTT FOOD BANK AWARD (2022)** A \$100 cash award for contribution of food grown by a FGCMD Garden Club and donated to a local food bank or to an FGCMD Garden Club working with a community garden in which food is distributed to a local food bank.
- **SE4 MARYLAND ROADSIDE AWARD** * (1979) The pewter tray may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club promoting the most outstanding roadside improvement.
- SE5 RAE B. WEEKS HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARD * (1992) The silver bowl may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for the restoration of a park, building and/or garden of importance to the heritage of our state.

COUNCIL AWARDS

Individual Council Award Applications Required

Note: Landscape Design and Gardening Consultants Council entries can also be submitted for an FGCMD Award;

Project or activity must have been completed in the current year.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTANTS COUNCIL

Submit Environmental Consultants Council Application to the Environmental Consultants Council Chairman by November 1. The FGCMD / NGC Awards Program Scoring Rubric will be used to evaluate the awards.

EC1 - JEAN LOWRY SUSTAINABLE LANDSCAPE AWARD – An Environmental Consultants Council Award of \$500 may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club for an outstanding sustainable landscape project displaying (1) an understanding of environmental stewardship practices (2) an educational component that teaches benefits of sustainable landscaping to the local community and (3) evidence of successful efforts to improve or reverse degradation of natural resources.

GARDENING CONSULTANTS COUNCIL

Submit Gardening Consultants Council Application to the Gardening Consultants Council Chairman by November 1; Applications can be submitted for a FGCMD award <u>AND</u> a Gardening Consultants Council award with the same project. The FGCMD / NGC Awards Program Scoring Rubric will be used to evaluate the awards.

- **GC1 CONTAINER GARDEN AWARD** A cash award of \$150 may be presented to FGCMD club(s) for a project featuring two or more outstanding container gardens that: (1) enhance a public space or (2) support the mission of a not-for-profit organization.
- **GC2 EDIBLE GARDEN AWARD** A cash award of \$150 may be presented to FGCMD club(s) for a project featuring an outstanding edible garden that: (1) provides a service to the public or (2) supports the mission of a not-for-profit organization.

LANDSCAPE DESIGN COUNCIL

Submit FGCMD/NGC Award Application Cover Sheet to the Landscape Design Council Chairman by November 1; Application can be submitted for a FGCMD award <u>AND</u> a Landscape Design Council award with the same project. The FGCMD / NGC Awards Program Scoring Rubric will be used to evaluate the awards.

LD1 - LANDSCAPE DESIGN AWARD FOR PUBLIC SPACES (1995) – This award may be presented annually to FGCMD garden club(s) for outstanding landscape work at a public site which includes historic and religious sites. Cash Awards: 1st place \$150; 2nd place \$100; 3rd place \$50 and Honorable Mention \$25. Project may not be submitted again within three (3) years.

LD2 - HABITAT FOR HUMANITY AWARD

This award of \$200 may be presented annually to FGCMD garden club(s) for work at a Habitat for Humanity site. The projects must be completed by September of the year submitted and may not be submitted again within three (3) years.

LD3 - HABITAT FOR HUMANITY PROPOSAL AWARD

This award of \$50 may be presented annually to FGCMD garden club(s) that submit a <u>proposal</u> for a Habitat for Humanity project.

LD4 - THE MAE SCOTT TAPESTRY LANDSCAPE AWARD (2010) - This award may be given annually to a FGCMD member or garden club for outstanding Tapestry Landscaping around an individual's home or a club's planned and maintained project. A cash award of \$250 for first place and \$150 for second place shall be presented to the recipients. The Tapestry Landscape may be an existing area, an improved planting area, or a newly planned and planted area. Submission of a book of evidence is required. Any individual or club who is awarded first place may not resubmit for this award within five (5) years.

Submit the NGC Flower Show Achievement Award application and Book of Evidence.

A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club, group of clubs, Council, District or to National Affiliate Plant Societies presenting a Standard Flower Show scoring 95 points or more and applying for a National Garden Club Flower Show Achievement Award.

FS2 - CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION (1986)

Submit Standard Flower Show Report (available at https://www.fgcofmd.org/coucilsandschools/flowershows/) and 2 copies of the show schedule no later than 10 days following the show date to the FGCMD Flower Show Evaluation Chairman.

A certificate may be awarded to a FGCMD garden club, group of clubs, Council, District or to National Affiliate Plant Societies presenting a Standard or Small Standard Flower Show whose show upholds the high standards of NGC, Inc., but not applying for a National Garden Clubs Flower Show Achievement Award.

FGCMD FLOWER SHOW AWARDS

The following are awarded ONLY at a Standard Flower Show Sponsored by FGCMD, Inc.:

- **ANN GORMAN STEWART AWARD** May be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon exhibit in the Design Division in classes designated in the Flower Show Schedule.
- MRS. EDWARD A. MAHER AWARD May be awarded to a member of a FGCMD Garden Club for the highest scoring blue ribbon exhibit in Design classes using all fresh plant material.
- **LUCY BENTON MEMORIAL BOWL** May be awarded to a member of a FGCMD Garden Club for a worthy exhibit in the Design Division.
- MARGARET ROBERTS YERGER AWARD May be awarded to a member of a FGCMD Garden Club accumulating the most blue ribbons in Horticulture classes for woody plants.
- ROBERT LEWIS BAKER MEMORIAL BOWL May be awarded to a member Club, District or individual member of a FGCMD Club for an outstanding Educational Exhibit.
- **ZENOBIA KENDIG AWARD (2006)** A certificate may be awarded from the FGCMD Gardening Consultants Council to the recipient of the Horticulture Excellence Award in a State sponsored Standard Flower Show.

All entries become property of FGCMD, Inc. The FGCMD will award \$100 and \$50 respectively for 1st and 2nd Place winners.

POETRY CONTEST

Submit entries to FGCMD District Awards Chairman by December 31

For K to 9th grade students sponsored by a single garden club, group of member clubs, councils or districts, or a state garden club. All entries become the property of National Garden Clubs, Inc. NGC Certificate of Commendation to National recipients at each grade level; CAR-SGC, Inc. Certificate of Recognition to recipient at each grade level.
